Community outreach

All PGY1 pharmacy practice residents will be primary preceptors for advanced pharmacy practice experience students from the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy in early 2021.

The PGY2 clinical pharmacogenomics resident will provide continuing education through annual MedWise recertification focused in PGx in early 2021.

Our PGY2 ambulatory care resident will also provide continuing education through Tabula Rasa HealthCare University in December.

Research highlights

- Dr. Katie Pizzolato is gaining approval for her research project from TRHC's Research Strategy Review Team and preparing to submit her IRB protocol in December 2020.
- Dr. Aashish Sreeram is in the data collection phase of his study. He will be analyzing the data and preparing a manuscript for submission in early 2021.
- Dr. Meghan Ha is completing data analysis and running comparisons between subgroups. She will be completing data visualization and presenting her findings to TRHC's Chief Scientific Officer in December 2020. Following the presentation, she will be preparing a manuscript for submission.
- Dr. Nicole Del Toro-Pagán is in the process of gaining approval for her research project aims and objectives from TRHC's Chief Scientific Officer and chief operating officer of the Precision Pharmacotherapy Research and Development Institute. Once approved, the IRB protocol will be submitted. Dr. Del Toro-Pagán has already created her data collection tool and is ready to collect data upon IRB approval.
- Dr. Karley Tranchina submitted her research project to the American Pharmacists Association Annual 2021 meeting. She is finalizing her data analysis and preparing to submit her manuscript in January 2021 for peer review.


